

Webster School District has the following policy in regard to administration of medications in school:

- Non-prescription drugs must come to school in the original manufacturer's packaging with ingredients and recommended therapeutic dose.
- A written permission note from the parent /guardian stating the child's name, medication and times that the medication should be given.
- All non-prescription medication shall be provided by the parent.
- Aspirin containing products require a doctor's prescription.
- Any non-prescription medication that needs to be given more than ten days in a row requires a doctor's prescription.
- Webster School District will not be providing any non-prescription medications such as acetaminophen (Tylenol), ibuprofen (Advil or Motrin), diphenhydramine (Benadryl) unless dispensed by the School Nurse with verbal permission from a parent or guardian.
- If your child requires any non-prescription medications, please bring a permission note along with the medication to the appropriate school office in its original container.
- Prescription medication requires a written permission note from the physician and parent. It must be in a legible pharmacy labeled container and brought to the appropriate office by the parent or guardian.
