**Policy Title: Graduation Credit Requirements**

26 Credits are required for Graduation. The following are required credits and the remaining credits may be earned as elective credits. A student may not earn more than two credits as a teacher's aide.

4 Credits of English

3 Credits of Math

3 Credits of Social Studies (1 Civics, 1 American History, 1 Elective)

3 Credits of Science (1 Physical Science, 1 General Biology, and 1 Elective)

1.5 Credits of Physical Education

.5 Credits of Health

1 Credit Business Education (.5 Personal Finance and .5 Computer Applications)

In order to be eligible for a District high school diploma, a student must have taken and successfully completed the state-required civics test while enrolled in the high school grades in the District or, as determined by the administration, in another qualifying school or program. A student with a disability for whom an individualized education program (IEP) is in effect must also take the civics test; however, his/her graduation shall not be conditioned on the successful completion of the test.

Students may not participate in the graduation exercise unless all graduation requirements have been satisfied, or at the discretion of the Principal.
