Policy Title: Instructional Materials Selection

- I. The legal responsibility for instructional materials used in the School District rest ultimately with the Board. Responsibility for selection of instructional materials shall, however, be delegated to the professionally trained staff employed by the school system.
- II. When selecting instructional materials for use in schools, consideration shall be given to the following objectives:
 - A. To promote and to provide materials that will enrich and support the curriculum taking into consideration the varied interests, abilities and maturity levels of the students served.
 - B. To provide materials that will stimulate growth in factual knowledge, literary appreciation, aesthetic values and ethical standards.
 - C. To provide a background of information which will enable students to make intelligent judgments in their daily lives.
 - D. To provide materials representative of the many religious, ethnic, and cultural groups and their contributions to our American heritage.
 - E. To provide materials of the highest quality in order to assure a comprehensive collection appropriate for users of the library media center.
- III. Specific instructional materials selection guidelines shall be developed by the Administration.
