No one shall possess, use, or store a weapon or look-alike weapon in school buildings, on school grounds, in school vehicles, or at school-sponsored activities, except as otherwise specifically provided. A dangerous weapon or look-alike weapon is defined by state statute to include, but not be limited to, guns, electric weapons, knives, metallic knuckles, martial arts equipment, or any other object which is capable of inflicting bodily harm, property damage, or which endangers the health and safety of students and staff. Ammunition and explosives are included within the weapons category.

Violation of this policy will be immediately reported to law enforcement or juvenile delinquency authorities as outlined in Chapter 48 of the Wisconsin Statutes. School personnel will confiscate dangerous weapons and a dangerous weapon(s) taken from a student will be reported to the student's parents/guardians. Any student violating this policy shall be subject to penalties outlined in the state law and referred for suspension or expulsion in accordance with state and federal law.

The building principal may allow weapons in the building for the following purposes:

- A. Weapons under the control of law enforcement personnel or by an individual in accordance with a contract entered into between a school and the individual or an employer of the individual;
- B. Theatrical props used in appropriate settings of starter pistols used in appropriate sporting events.
- C. For the purpose of approved school activity, demonstration, education presentations, or safety classes. Approval must be in writing and granted prior to the weapon being brought to the school. The weapon shall be maintained in the possession of the principal or person(s) designated by the principal, except during the actual demonstration or presentation.
- D. Weapons may only be used by school district employees for school-sanctioned purposes.
