



Webster School District has the following Medication Guideline in regard to administration of medications in school:

- Non-prescription drugs must come to school in the original manufacturer's packaging with ingredients and recommended therapeutic dose.
- Prescription Medication given more than ten days in a row requires a Medication Administration Form completed and signed by the ordering Provider authorizing Webster School District to administer medication during school hours.
- All non-prescription medication shall be provided by the parent/guardian. A Non-Prescription Authorization form must be completed with the child's name, medication and times that the medication should be given and signature by parent/guardian.
- Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Ibuprofen (Advil or Motrin), Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) require verbal approval and authorization by parent/guardian prior to medication being administered.
- Infirmary form must be completed each school year to authorize over the counter treatment options for students. See Infirmary Form for more details.
