Continuing our efforts to provide more access for students, they may now bring their own wireless mobile learning devices to school. This includes personal laptops, smart phones, portable storage media, and other handheld devices such as iPods and iPads. Students are able to access our secure network with their own device before, during, and after school.

We have developed guidelines to ensure that learning is the key focus and we promote the use of technology to enhance this experience for students and staff. As we encourage students to take advantage of Web 2.0 tools to collaborate, do their homework, access resources, etc. the <u>Bring Your</u> <u>Own Device program allows students to use their own device in a way that provides access to our system and filtered network while at school and continued access beyond the school day that has not been present previously.</u>

• The student/staff is responsible for the operation of the device. The Webster School District is not allocating district resources for troubleshooting purposes.

• The device may only access the Internet using the school's wireless network. They may NOT use a 3G/4G data plan.

• The student/staff will be held accountable to the district responsible use policy, which governs conduct on the Internet, while using his/her personal device. Webster Schools presents BYOD • Webster School District is not responsible if the device is lost, stolen, or damaged. The school is also not responsible for the cost of any additional data usage that may occur.

• Wireless access is for internet usage only. The school's internal network, which includes folders and printers, are not available.

 The use of the device during the school days is at the discretion of the staff.
The primary use is of an educational nature.

Of note: The Webster School District has two wireless, guest networks. The first one is Tiger-Wireless. It is available during the school day and is intended for staff and students who are part of the Webster schools. It will provide layered access to the Internet, which allows older students and staff more access than a true guest network. The second network is called Webster-Guest. It will be available outside of normal school hours and requires no login of any kind. It is filtered at the lowest level.
